



Pink Class Use & Guidelines

Updated: 2025

The association (ADC NSW) continues to review its policies and procedures to ensure that we are providing a safe and positive training environment. The following guidelines outline the purpose and appropriate usage of the Pink session.

- Pink Class is available only to **Red & Blue** class members. For safety concerns, all other class level members should not over-train their dogs or use equipment unsupervised.
- Members wishing to use Pink class must advise Club officials at Check-In. Please do not use the Facebook group or private message Club Officials as they may not see the message.
- Equipment: Members may request that equipment be left out after Yellow Class when checking in. Priority use of the equipment will be allocated to the curriculum classes.
- Members are **NOT PERMITTED** to interchange between any classes. If you choose to use Pink, you must remain in that class for that training session. This is to prevent interruption and distraction to instructors and other class members. Handlers must choose a single class to train in in the evening.
