

ADC's Yellow Attire System

We are now using this system!

Therefore, some handlers will be wearing a bright yellow vest, and their dogs may also be wearing a yellow item such as a lead or collar. The leads and collars can sometimes be hard to identify. ADC has now purchased some yellow vests, which can be loaned from the office at the start of training.



Dogs and Handlers with these require a little extra personal space!

Dogs need more space for a variety of reasons, such as:

- They might be recovering from injury.
- Scare or startle easily.
- Nervous around new dogs/ environments.
- The owner wants them to focus on training.
- Reactive to other dogs/people getting in their personal space.
- Become highly aroused in a working environment.

If you see a handler wearing a yellow vest and a dog wearing a yellow collar, please give them extra space while standing near or walking past them. Under no circumstances should you or your dog approach them.

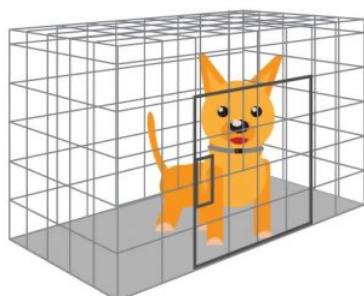
Dogs in Crates or Vehicle Stowed (working out of car).

The club strongly recommends bringing a crate and using this at training. Alternatively, you may elect to work out of your vehicle. Our ground rules are that dogs must be crated or securely stowed in a car when not conducting a drill in class. This includes setting up and packing down classes.

REMINDER: Generally, give space to Crated dogs, and avoid approaching vehicles with dogs stowed in them. They must be left alone for safety.

Please do not let yourself or your dog approach or encounter any dogs who may be crated or stowed in their car. Please also leave sufficient spacing between others when in class.

QUICK TIPS:



- Secure the crate with a latch or zip.
- Covers can minimise attention distraction.
 - Dogs must be secured in vehicles.
- All dogs in crates or cars must have airflow and water supplies.
- Avoid going near other dogs when entering/exiting crates or cars.
